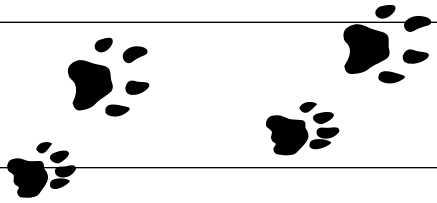


SUMMER READING REQUIREMENTS  
FOR STUDENTS AT  
JAMES ISLAND MIDDLE SCHOOL



Students should read at least 3 books of their own choice and record these three books, plus any other reading in the CCSD Summer Reading log.

**On the back of this brochure is a SUGGESTED list of nominated titles for the South Carolina Book Awards. Students do not have to choose from this list. It is only a list of possible titles!**

**SIXTH GRADE:** Students would use books from the Children's Book Award, the Junior Book Award titles, or free choice.

**SEVENTH GRADE:** Students would use books from the Children's Book Award, the Junior Book Award titles, or free choice.

**EIGHTH GRADE:** Students would use books from the Junior Book Award, the **optional** Young Adult Book Award titles, or free choice.

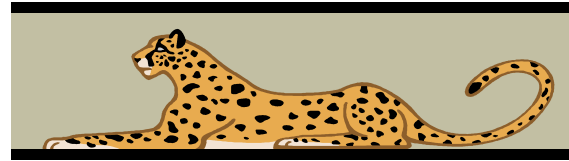
The YABA list is **OPTIONAL** and may include titles that contain mature subject matter or language. If in doubt, go with the Junior list.
